IN-PERSON VOTING

• Casting a ballot in person on Election Day guarantees your vote will count. It's the safest, most secure way to make your voice heard.

ABSENTEE VOTING

You're eligible to vote absentee without a notary if due to:

- Incapacity or confinement due to illness
- Having contracted coronavirus or at-risk (in 2020) due to the following:
 - o Age 65 or older
 - o Living in a long term care facility
 - Chronic lung disease/asthma
 - o Serious heart condition
- o Immunocompromised
- o Diabetes
- o Chronic kidney disease and undergoing dialysis
- Liver disease

You're eligible to vote absentee with a notary if due to:

- o Religious beliefs or practice
- Working as an election worker
- o Incarceration, if still eligible to vote
- o Absence on Election Day from your election jurisdiction
- o Certified participation in an address confidentiality program

FACTS TO KNOW

- October 21 at 5 p.m. is the deadline to request an absentee ballot by mail for the **November 3** election.
- Absentee ballots may be requested in person up until the day before Election Day.
- Ballots may be turned in by mail or in person.
- Your ballot must be received by 7 p.m. on Election Day.

MAIL-IN VOTING

You're eligible to vote by mail-in if you are a registered voter.

- Complete an application to request a mail-in ballot in person or by mail.
- Deliver to election authority by October 21 at 5 p.m. for the November 3 election.
- After receiving a ballot, fill it out and have the envelope notarized.
- Return your mail-in ballot through **U.S. mail** in time for its receipt by 7 p.m. on Election Day.
